How to do well at English GCSE 2

- Analyse texts closely and in detail.
- Use time wisely in exams- work well under pressure.
- Build up revision over time.
- Write and spell accurately and confidently



Work hard and invest effort on deficits.

How can you help?

- · Get copies of the set texts- read them; discuss the ideas and how they are presented.
- Focus on Language Literature looks scary but Language is equally challenging as it requires more independence in the exam.
- If you get study guides ensure they are not used passively- check activity is varied.
- · Supervise timed and silent exam practice



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
